

Major Reid L. Sawyer is the Director and one of the founders of the Combating Terrorism Center at West Point. A career intelligence officer, he has served in a variety of special operations assignments, involving operations in Iraq, Africa, and South America. Major Sawyer actively advises a number of federal, state and local governmental agencies regarding the terrorist threat and is a member of the Fire Department of New York Terrorism Task Force.
